**Captain Tsubasa** began with the protagonist Tsubasa Ozora meeting with soccer player Genzo Wakabayashi in his nearby model city, Nakatsu. Shizuka Ozora, the name Nakatsu, is a fictional location where the story takes place is an idea unique to Mr. Yoichi Takahashi, the author of "Captain Tsubasa". Nakatsu Shizuka Ozora, who is from Yotsugi, has been more than 40 years since the series began. "Captain Tsubasa" is still beloved by many people as a symbol of presence of this community.

#### Arakawa Riverside

Close to Yotsugi Station,



Arakawa River is a first-class river, 173 km long, that flows through Saitama and Tokyo prefectures and empties into Tokyo Bay. There are several football fields on the riverbed on the Katsushika side. On the other side of the river is the Tokyo Sky Tree.

#### Yotsugi Tsubasa Park

Park location: 1-22-3 Yotsugi, Katsushika City, Tokyo



On March, 2013, the statue of Tsubasa Ozora, the first bronze statue ever to be placed from the "Captain Tsubasa" series, was unveiled at Yotsugi Tsubasa Park. The statue is a life-size representation of Tsubasa as an elementary school student and is 145 cm tall.



On March, 2014, two bronze statues were publicly shown: one of Tsubasa Ozora performing his signature move "heel lift," and the other of Genzo Wakabayashi giving instructions to his team members. The Tsubasa Ozora statue was placed at Tateishi 1-chome children's playground and the Wakabayashi statue was placed at Tateishi Michihiroku.
